

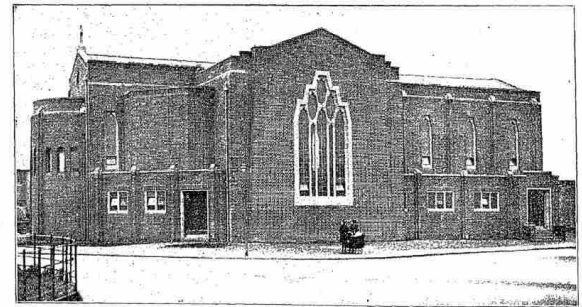

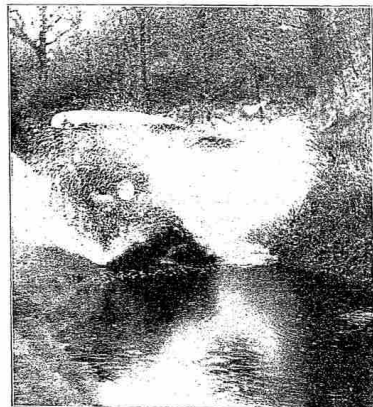
Winter sunshine and mist in the woods at Mellerstain, the Berwickshire residence of the Earl of Haddington.



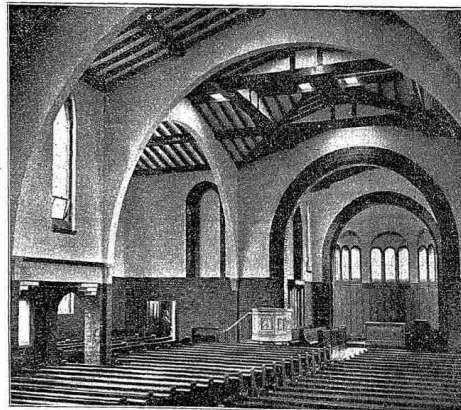
MAKING FRIENDS.—Young Saarlanders sampling the cookery of the Essex Regiment stationed near Neunkirchen. [By telegraph.]



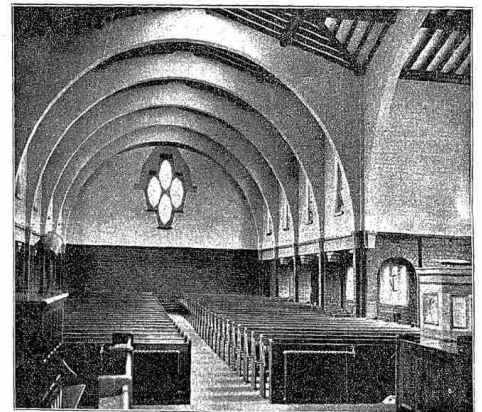

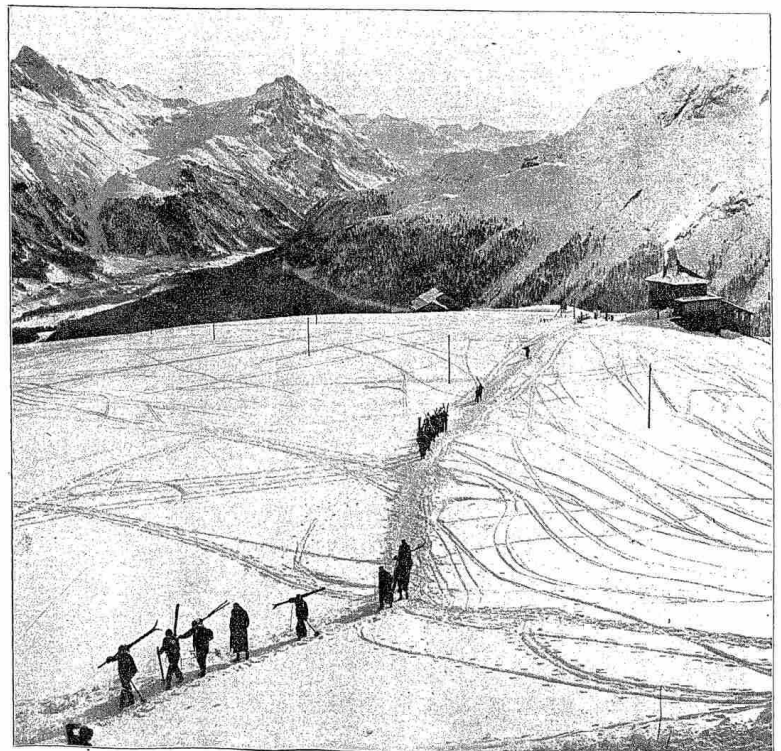
